

Indonesia's Electrification Rate Passes 71%

Eastern Indonesia still has the lowest electrification ratio.

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VIVAnews - Up until October 2011, the national electrification rate has reached 71.2 percent, meaning that power can be consumed by majority of the region in the country.

Based on Q3 data from state electricity company Perusahaan Listrik Negara (PLN), electrification ratio in Java and Bali was 75.4 percent, followed by western and eastern Indonesia of 68.2 percent and 59.2 percent, respectively.

In western Indonesia, the highest electrification ratio was reached by Aceh province and the lowest by South Sumatra province.

Eastern Indonesia still has the lowest electrification ratio. The lowest one is Papua province of 32.7 percent, followed by East Nusa Tenggara and West Nusa Tenggara of 37.4 percent and 43.6 percent, respectively.
